Easter Egg Suncatchers

Materials:

- Wax paper
- Glue
- Tissue paper



Instructions:

Cut an egg shape out of wax paper. Cover with glue and decorate with tissue paper.

*No tissue paper, no problem! Mix food colouring with the glue or use Sharpie markers and create an Easter design.

Laced Egg

Materials:

- Cardstock or cardboard
- Construction paper
- Glue
- Holepunch
- Yarn or ribbon
- Scissors



Instructions:

Cut an egg shape out of cardstock. Cut the construction paper into strips and glue to the cardstock. Trim the excess strips from the egg shape, then holepunch around the outside of the egg. Lace the yarn through the holes (for ease of threading place a small piece of tape around the end of the yarn to avoid fraying.) Once the yarn has been laced through all the holes, complete by tying with a bow.

*Option: instead of construction paper, children can colour the egg shape before lacing.

Rice Krispie Eggs



Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons butter
- 1 package (10 oz., about 40) Marshmallows **OR** 4 cups Miniature Marshmallows
 - 6 cups Kellogg's® Rice Krispies® cereal

Directions

1. In large saucepan melt butter over low heat. Add marshmallows and stir until completely melted. Remove from heat.
2. Add Rice Krispies cereal. Stir until well coated.
3. Shape treats into egg shapes. Eggs can then be decorated with icing and candy, if desired.

MICROWAVE DIRECTIONS:

In microwave-safe bowl heat butter and marshmallows on HIGH for 3 minutes, stirring after 2 minutes. Stir until smooth. Follow steps 2 and 3 above. Microwave cooking times may vary.

***Kitchen Tip!: Coat your hands in butter before shaping the eggs so the Rice Krispies don't stick to you!**

***Colour option: add food colouring to the marshmallows before adding the Rice Krispies!**
